

**Consumer Protection (Control of imports)
Regulations 1999 – (GN No 135)
Gas Regulator**

Checklist of documents to be submitted for verification of Test Reports / Certificates of Conformity	
1	Request letter from Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Consumer Protection (Commerce Division).
2	Original or certified true copy of test report or certificate of conformity as per EN 12864.
3	Each Gas Regulator should be indelibly and clearly marked with the certification mark EN12864 and accompanied by their instructions for use and maintenance.
4	EN 12864 Low Pressure, non adjustable regulators having a maximum outlet pressure of less than or equal to 200 mbar, with a capacity of less than or equal to 4 kg/h, and their associated safety devices for butane, propane or their mixtures.
5	A sample of the Gas Regulator must be produced as evidence at the time of submission of request for verification purposes.

Notes

- **A minimum of 3-5 working days is required for the processing of requests .**
- **Application fee of Rs 600 will be charged for each sample submitted. A surcharge of 10% will be levied if reports are not collected within 30 days after invoicing.**
- **Reports or Certificates that are doubtful will be crosschecked with the Issuing/testing laboratory and may require a longer processing time. In the event of a negative feedback from the laboratory, there will be no further processing of the test report and client will still have to pay the required fees.**

- **Test Reports where data or any other information appearing is not clear, will not be accepted.**
- **Standards or specifications that identical with the above standards may also be considered, if specified in the regulations.**
- **No application will be processed until all relevant documents are received.**
- **Payment by cash/cheque to be made in favor of the Mauritius Standards Bureau.**
- **Clients having an outstanding balance will be required to clear any previous balances before the issue of Certificate of Conformity.**
